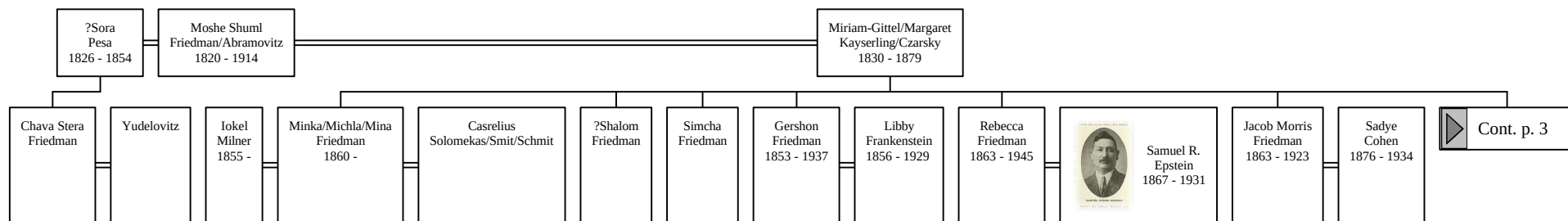

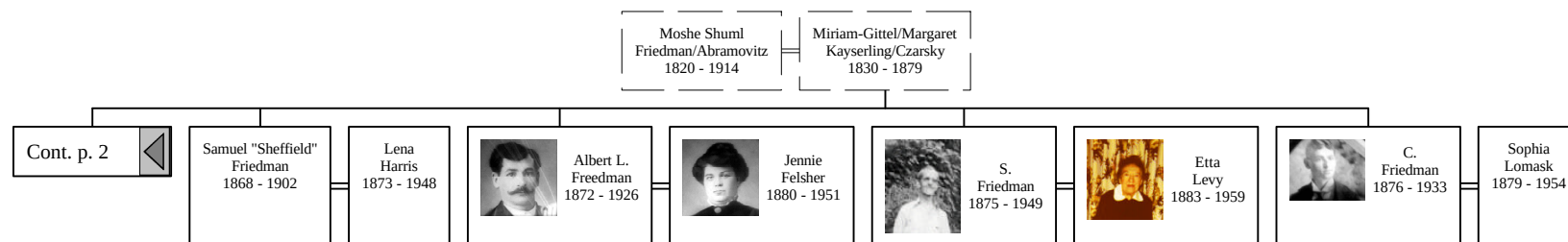

JEWS settled in Kurland earlier than in other parts of Latvia.

According to the historian Reuven Wunderbar, Jewish settlement there began in the 16th century. The first-comers originated from East Prussia. They came by sea as merchants, and eventually established their home in Hasenpot and Pilten. The Bishop of Pilten encouraged Jews to stay, realizing the usefulness of their trading between Prussia and his district. The greater part of Jewish immigration into Kurland, however, came across the southern border, namely from Lithuania.

Kurland was incorporated into the Russian Empire in 1795. Its Jewish population at that time amounted to less than 5000 souls. It is interesting to note that only 20% lived in towns, while 80% found a livelihood in the countryside, on the large estates of the German Barons, as petty artisans, innkeepers, land tenants and peddlars. In 1850, fifty-five years later, the Jewish population in Kurland had grown to 22,000; and by the end of the century, in 1897, it reached the impressive number of 51,000.

Economic Developments at the End of the 19th Century

During the second half of the 19th century important developments took place in Russia's foreign trade, its export being channelled to a great extent through the Baltic sea ports of Riga, Libau and Windau. Two important railway lines were laid for the export of Russian grain through the two latter ports: The Romni-Libau Line and the Rybinsk-Windau Line. These two ports had the advantage over Riga of being open for shipping all the year round, whereas the big port of Riga was closed during the winter months because of massive ice. To store the grain at the exit ports, huge silos were built with modern facilities for speedy loading into vessels. Libau had a further economic asset, namely a naval port where part of the Russian Baltic fleet was stationed.

These economic changes had a great impact on the port cities, which prospered and grew fast. However, inland towns like Goldingen, Talsen, Sasmaken, Zabeln, and others had only a small share in the economic expansion and remained almost untouched in their idyllic quaintness. Zabeln, Kandau, Talsen and their surroundings were called the "Switzerland of Kurland" for their romantic beauty. (The name Talsen is supposed to be a combination of the German words "Tal" and "See", meaning "valley" and "lake".) Goldingen on the shore of the Venta river, with its waterfall, its wonderful big park in the heart of the town, its classic German gymnasium and entirely German atmosphere, had a particularly provincial character, with practically no change for generations in spite of its industries: A match factory (Hirschmann), a needle factory, and a flourmill, all belonging to Jews.

Mitau was the seat of the central government administration, where the Governor of Kurland resided. Tuksum had the advantage of two railway lines meeting there; while Hasenpot, for example, enjoyed its position on the crossroads from Goldingen to Libau, with which there was a narrow gauge railroad from Hasenpot.

Cultural Influences from East and West

Kurland was not part of the Pale of Settlement (the part of Russia where Jews were permitted to live), and only those who were born there had the right of residence. In spite of restrictions, however, the influx of Jews from other parts of Russia, and in the first place from Lithuania, was very considerable throughout the 19th century. There had always been neighbourly ties of all kinds between Kurland and the adjacent sections of Lithuania. There were no Yeshivot (Talmudical academies) in Kurland. For this reason well-to-do Jews in Kurland sent their sons to study at the famous Yeshivot of Volozhin, Slobodka, Telsh, Mir, and others. They also chose learned young Yeshiva students as husbands for their daughters. Eventually these students became rabbis or teachers, who were badly needed in Kurland. Most of the rabbis in Kurland who established a succession of renowned rabbinical families originated in Lithuania. To mention only a few: The Rabbis Eliasbere (Bausk), Samunoff (Windau, Mitau), Lichtenstein (Tuksum) and Nurock (Mitau, Libau). Rabbi Abraham Yitzhak Hacoen Kook resided in Bausk, and later became Chief Rabbi of Israel. Thus Lithuania had a considerable share in Jewish religious education and spiritual leadership in Kurland.

However, winds of knowledge and education also blew from the West. Famous educators came to Kurland from Germany. Thus David Friedlander, a pupil of Moses Mendelssohn, and Professor Marcus Hertz of Berlin, both resided in Mitau for several years. The Emancipation and the ensuing urge for contemporary education in neighbouring Germany did not pass without influencing the Jews in Kurland who, in fact, were quite perceptive to Western culture, their language being German (Kurisches Deutsch), even if they also spoke Yiddish. Indeed, long before Friedlander and Hertz came to Kurland, the German cultural influence on the Jewish population there was paramount. The historian Wunderbar remarks in his book, which appeared in 1853: "As to their (the Jews of Kurland's) education, it is most satisfactory. Even the poor do their utmost to give their children a fair education, and among the adults there are practically none who do not command the German language."

As it happened, there was no competition between East and West in guiding the Jews of Kurland. On the contrary, both complemented each other. Where the East took the lead in Jewish religious education, the West cared for the secular aspects.

All these developments and currents created the unique type of the Kurland Jew, often named "Kurischer" by his brethren from other parts of Latvia. It meant the Jew from the province, straightforward, not too smart, observant but not very learned, a person with a distinctly German background who at the same time was responsive to cultural and spiritual influences from the Russian provinces.

Emigration

The favourable economic developments during the second half of the 19th and the beginning of the 20th century were a blessing to the Jewish population in Kurland. However, not all parts of the country enjoyed the economic upsurge to the same degree. As already mentioned, the sea-port cities of Libau and Windau were prospering. They attracted Jews from neighbouring communities. Libau gained new residents from Grobin, Hasenpoth and Goldingen; Windau from Pilten (virtually the entire Jewish population gradually moved to Windau), Zabeln, Talsen, Sasmaken and Kandau. However, Libau and Windau, and even the big city of Riga, were unable to absorb all those who struggled for a livelihood. With the approach of the 20th century, emigration to the United States of America set in, expanding considerably with the terror and persecution following the abortive revolution of 1905, and reaching South Africa and England. In this context it may be of interest to mention a historical episode which took place 60-65 years earlier, namely in the year 1840, when 341 Jewish families, consisting of 2530 souls, emigrated to the south of Russia (Kherson Guberniya) to work on the land there. The emigrants were mainly from Mitau, Bausk, Hasenpoth and Goldingen, the communities which suffered most from lack of gainful occupation. This enterprise was sponsored by the Russian Government, but also by some Jewish leaders and educators from Germany like Dr. Max Lilienthal, who called for the productivisation of the Jewish masses.

The Revolution of 1905

In spite of the fact that Kurland scarcely had an organized labour force among its Jewish population, Jewish youth took an active part in the rising against the Russian Government in 1905. They paid a high price for their participation, when the reaction set in and the Revolution was smashed with an iron fist. To liquidate the revolting Latvian peasants who rebelled against their landlords the German barons, chasing them out of their estates and setting their mansions on fire, the Russian Government sent a punitive task force consisting of Cossack and dragoon detachments to Kurland. Latvian peasants in hundreds were executed on the spot, while Jewish revolutionaries -- real or suspect -- were not spared either. In Windau two Jews, Meir Wulfson and young Behrman, were shot by the Russians. Fearing pogroms, Jews and Latvians organized a common self-defence which did not abstain from attacking the government forces wherever possible.

High government officials representative of the Tsarist regime were assassinated. On a Saturday morning the District Commissioner, Colonel Brown, was shot dead in Windau on the way to his office. The assailant was never identified. In Tuklum, the town commandant and 17 dragoons were killed by revolutionaries; which, of course, led to condign punishment on the part of the authorities. An entire section of Tuklum was wiped out, including several Jewish families. Shaul Berman and Jacob Blumenthal from Tuklum were sentenced to death for taking part in the rising, but managed to escape before it was too late. Israel Friedman of Bausk, a locksmith, was accused of making arms for the self-defence and was executed.

The authorities did not abstain from taking hostages either. In Tuklum two Jewish notables, Gerschon Paul Berner and Leonard Gerson, were held as hostages and released only after payment of a heavy fine. (These details have been told by Dr. Meir Berner, a native of Tuklum now residing in Israel.)

Talsen suffered more than any other town in Kurland. The Russian dragoons surrounded the town and fired indiscriminately, setting it on fire. Half of the place went up in flames. There were several Jewish casualties, among them a young man by the name of Ludwig Thalberg.

Dr. Jerome Friedman made an imprint
in his community through his work as an
optometrist and social activist, and was
Known among friends and family for his
insatiable curiosity.

"Friedman, 88, died Nov. 23 of renal failure
in UPMC Shadyside. A Pittsburgh native
and longtime resident of Stanton
Heights, he lived most recently at The
Residence on Fifth in Oakland.
For 40 years, he ran his own optometry
practice in Tarentum. His daughter,
Debbie Friedman, said he chose to locate his
practice in the Allegheny Valley community to
bring his services to people who
might otherwise not have access to eye
exams.

"He probably could have located in a
more affluent area," she said. "He was the
•only optometrist in town. He became very
devoted to that community."

This devotion to meeting the needs of
others was further expressed in his political
activism on such causes as racial integration,
demonstrating for peace, organizing unions
and protesting nuclear war. "He had his impact
on almost- every progressive cause in the city,"
Debbie Friedman said. His late wife Ruth shared
his commitment and worked with him on
Dr. Jerome Friedman a number of causes.

Friedman co-founded the Stanton Heights
Civic Association, which his daughter called
one of his proudest accomplishments.

"He worked very hard to keep that a viable,
harmonious neighborhood," she said
of Stanton Heights, where her father lived
from 1953 until the mid-1990s.-

Friedman was also proud to serve as

president of the local chapter of Americans for Democratic Action.

"He was a fierce and passionate Democrat," said Lois Goldstein, a close friend. He was also constantly learning new things, said Goldstein. Even in his last few weeks, when he was declining physically, his mind was still sharp, so much so that the day before his death, he told family members how he wanted to be eulogized.

Goldstein said he was also a positive thinker, which was unusual for a man his age.

"He continued to have optimism, which is something you so seldom see," Goldstein said. "He always had an optimistic view of people, humanity, the future."

Debbie Friedman said her father's world view was deeply influenced by his Jewish heritage, although he was not a particularly religious man.

"When any of us asked him where his social commitment came from, he always pointed to Rabbi [Samuel] Goldenson (of Rodef Shalom Congregation)," she said. "He was very strongly committed to Jewish values."

His three children and seven grandchildren learned from his example, and many of them are now involved in social justice and political causes, such as his daughter, who is the executive director of Jewish Residential Services.

"He was just one of those tireless people who never lost his energy and never lost his hope," she said.

In addition to his daughter, Friedman is survived by sons Robert of Oak Park, 111., and Daniel; siblings Frank, Edna Belle Kalson and Paula Ruth Mitchel; and grandchildren Jacob, Max and Rachael Dizard; Daniel and Jesse Friedman and Benjamin and Leah Friedman. "If I had to dream up the ideal job, this would be it," Deborah Friedman Dizard, newly-appointed executive director of Jewish Residential Services, Inc., says. _____

Dizard's job combines her past work experience with volunteer service, as well as direct involvement in care for people with mental illness. Add to that grant proposal writing and fundraising, and Dizard is well suited to head JRS.

. The agency itself, explains Board President Kathy Hurwitz, was born "in response to the fact that one of the greatest needs in our community is the lack of special facilities for special needs people in our neighborhood. "What happens," she continues, "is that besides having a disability, they are also displaced. We want to integrate them into the community."

JRS realized that the largest unmet need was in the population of Jews who are chronically mentally ill. The agency decided, for its first project, to set up a residential facility for 8 to 10 such people, supervised by 24 hour full-time staff. The residence itself would be based within the Jewish community and have a Jewish flavor.

For seven months, Jewish Residential Services carried on its work, without a professional at the helm - "but with an enthusiastic and committed board," notes Dizard. "They were able to make remarkable progress in actualizing the first residence even without the help of a professional.

"At the heart," she continues, "is that individuals in the general and Jewish community recognize that the need for such programs is so great. The Jewish community is particularly on the cutting edge." Hurwitz concurs. "Our program has received recog-

dition and endorsements from all over, from both Jewish and non-Jewish agencies including United Mental Health, the University of Pittsburgh and the Western Psychiatric Institute. They think it's wonderful that the Jewish community is opening a culturally-based facility, and the hope is that others will use our model.

"We in the Jewish community have realized that it is our obligation to include all members as an integral part of the community," Hurwitz adds, "and we haven't met any resistance in any phase."

Both Hurwitz and Dizard feel the response to JRS is so great "because almost every family is in some way affected by this. There are few families where mental illness is a distant problem. Everybody knows someone with emotional problems."

Though a residence for the chronically mentally ill is the first project, it is by no means JRS's only focus.

"We have plans to move on to a variety of other kinds of facilities to serve special needs populations -- the physically disabled and mentally handicapped as well. We hope to serve all populations with disabilities, so that they will not be banished from the community anymore," adds Hurwitz.

"People tend to be more comfortable when they can live in a community with appropriate support services - socialization, recreation. There is a certain 'comfort level' of being in a familiar community."

Dizard is not new to the concept of a residential facility focusing on mentally ill individuals. A Pittsburgher who moved away for 20 years, she began as a physician's assistant but moved into "psychiatrically oriented areas by choice. My first experience working in a community mental health center with chronically ill adults in North Carolina became my most enduring

interest," she notes. Her work in North Carolina included serving as a curriculum coordinator for a medical ethics program as well as chairperson of the board for two community-based group home facilities. One, Serendipity House, dealt with emotionally disturbed children and adolescents. Fellowship Home of Winston-Salem, Inc. handled alcoholism services.

Dizard returned to Pittsburgh five years ago with her three children, Jacob, 12; Max, 9; and Rachael, 6. She was associated with the Parental Stress Center and wrote grant proposals and reports for the Oakland Planning and Development Corporation before accepting the job at Jewish Residential Services, Inc. Dizard notes that the Jewish community, which "has enormous ability to look at things on an international basis, and meet pressing needs all over the world is now beginning to see the needs in its own community. "One thing has happened in general," Dizard explains. "People have, over the last 20 years, become more willing to acknowledge deficits and problems in the community. One of these is to really care for people who don't fit the mold. They need special, extra support. "On the other hand," she continues, "that's not just within the Jewish community. Through a combination of social policy and the fancies of state and federal government, you have the situation where medication can control the most flagrant symptoms, so more and more people are put back in the community with persistent mental illness. They're not hidden away anymore. "To ask the individual family to completely shoulder the burden of that is unfair to them and to the individual, who needs the support and connection to

the larger community to be at their best, to maximize function."

JRS will purchase a building in the next few months. Once done, they will begin to develop appropriate programming and admissions criteria.

"We envision our clientele as being people who will be able to integrate well into a residential community," outlines Dizard. "A very small proportion of people with serious mental illness pose a threat to themselves or anyone else. We're dealing with a population that needs support to maximize growth, who are independent, but who can and do abide by the general rules of society."

The ultimate aim of the residential facility, Dizard explains, is not set in concrete, for each resident will react differently. "Some may get to the point where they can live more independently and move out; some may not. We will be home for people who need us on a long term basis as well as a stepping stone towards greater independence. We don't want our expectations to be beyond their capability. Mental illness is quite treatable at this point, but it is not curable."

Even though the house will have a Jewish identity and be culturally Jewish orientation, it will be open to Jews and non-Jews alike. But Jewish clients are most likely to benefit.

Notes one possible resident: "I don't want to be isolated and shunned. I need friends and moral support. Having a mental illness doesn't mean we don't want the same things you want - a home, security and the help of people who care."

Sally Kalson, an iconic Pittsburgh Post-Gazette reporter and columnist whose sharp mind, passionate opinions and powerful writing eviscerated her foes and defended her heroes for nearly 30 years, died Friday from complications of ovarian cancer. She was 63.

Don't let the obituary writer say "after a courageous battle with cancer," she advised a few close friends. What a cliché that would be, and anyway, what choice did she have but to be courageous? Ms. Kalson told them.

Funny, incisive and dogged, Ms. Kalson's tough-minded reporting and commentary were equally effective in exploring the complex realities of the rights of women, minorities and the working class, and placing a cross-hairs on any target she thought deserved one. In recent years, the tax-exempt status of UPMC, and its ongoing battle with insurer Highmark, were frequent subjects of her outrage. Republicans who sought to curb access to birth control were another, as were any politicians whom she felt placed ideology or ambition over the essential needs of everyday people.

As she was entering her fourth round of chemotherapy at UPMC, she took a personal approach in a memorable column published Dec. 18, 2011.

"I wonder if UPMC President Jeffrey Romoff would like to come down from his penthouse and inhabit my world for the next few months," wrote Ms. Kalson, of Squirrel Hill, in describing her dilemma at the time. "Maybe then he'd see the colossal folly of threatening to separate me and millions of others from

affordable access to trusted medical providers when we're already holding on by our fingernails.

"The last thing I need in the midst of aching and retching and sleepless nights contemplating my own mortality is UPMC's president threatening to price me out of future access to the team that is keeping me alive."

Since then, the two health care giants have worked toward resolving the question of access to oncology services for Highmark clients at UPMC facilities.

Ms. Kalson's fierce advocacy of social justice was matched by the intensity of her affection for and loyalty to her friends, both in the Post-Gazette's newsroom and in the community at large.

"Sally was one of the special — one of the very special— people here," said John Robinson Block, the Post-Gazette's publisher and editor-in-chief.

After joining the Post-Gazette in 1984, Ms. Kalson became an indispensable voice for many of the newspaper's readers, her many friends and colleagues said. She never backed down from defending what she believed was right, and almost no subject was beneath her notice if it affected people whose stories needed to be told, they said.

"Almost no city for a generation has had a columnist or reporter who stood as a symbol of her city, and who acted as her city's conscience, the way Sally Kalson did for the Post-Gazette and for Pittsburgh," said David M. Shribman, executive editor of the newspaper. "Sally represented the Post-Gazette throughout this region but, more than that, won the love of this region, even from those many she skewered and called to task. We here at the paper and those in her family are not the only ones who are grieving today."

Born Oct. 21, 1950, Ms. Kalson grew up in Mt. Lebanon, graduating from Mt. Lebanon High School in 1968. After earning a bachelor of arts degree with a major in speech and communications from the University of Pittsburgh in 1972, she worked as the society editor for the Jewish Chronicle of Pittsburgh, then as public relations director for Tri-State Israel Bonds until 1977.

She then took a job as a contributing editor for the now-defunct Pittsburgher Magazine, which opened in 1977 and closed the following year, when she left as its assistant editor. She next worked as an associate editor for Pennsylvania Illustrated Magazine in Harrisburg from 1979 to 1980.

She left that magazine to work as a freelance writer for publications including The New York Times Magazine and Pittsburgh Magazine. She also began teaching journalism classes — news and feature writing, and magazine writing and editing — at Chatham College beginning in 1982.

In 1984, she began her career at the Post-Gazette, writing a weekly column of social satire, political commentary and personal observation beginning in 1988, while also writing in-depth profiles and stories focused on contemporary issues. While she loved spending time with her family and friends, news stories were never far from her mind, said her husband, Ed Feinstein of Squirrel Hill.

"She just loved the paper and the people who worked there," he said, reminiscing about news tips Ms. Kalson phoned in while they vacationed in Florida, their wedding she postponed several times in 1988 because she wanted to cover a murder trial, and how her series on the "10 most arrogant judges in Allegheny County" made his job as a lawyer even more interesting. "I always thought of her as a newspaperwoman and that's the term, not reporter or columnist but newspaperwoman — she just loved the newsroom, the hustle and bustle."

As a fierce advocate for women's rights, Ms. Kalson's integrity shone through not only in her fearless, powerful writing but also in her relationships with other women in media, said Heather Arnet, CEO of the Women and Girls Foundation. The group honored Ms. Kalson in 2010 for her contributions to journalism.

"It's hard to imagine not including Sally, not just because she was an advocate for women but also because she was an incredible mentor and friend to other women in the newsroom," Ms. Arnet said. "She was another woman that young women could look up to, and she reminded us what journalism was about."

In addition to championing civil rights, women's rights and the rights of the disenfranchised, Ms. Kalson was a strong supporter of organized labor in her columns and her workplace. At the Post-Gazette, her co-workers so respected her that for nearly 25 consecutive years they elected her to represent them as a leader of the Newspaper Guild of Pittsburgh, the newspaper's union for reporters, photographers, artists, paginators, copy editors and other editorial positions.

She held a variety of positions, such as secretary and vice president, but her mark was most prominent and lasting in negotiating 10 contracts between the guild and the Post-Gazette that included such provisions as benefits for same-sex partners and single parents, and quality-of-life issues such as expansions of paid time off, and sick and family leaves.

“Sally was the heart, soul and moral compass of the guild,” said Post-Gazette reporter and guild president Michael A. Fuoco, whose hiring at the newspaper and work with the guild corresponded with Ms. Kalson’s. “In negotiations, I loved sitting next to her, seeing her eyes narrow and fill with fire when a company proposal violated her sense of justice. And then she would thrust and parry with the company with such skill and logic that we all, on both sides of the table, were in awe.”

Ms. Kalson was instrumental in the Newspaper Guild’s 2001 creation with the Screen Actors Guild/American Federation of Television and Radio Artists of “Off the Record,” an annual musical-comedic satire of all things Pittsburgh that has raised more than \$400,000 for the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank and other charitable causes. She was gifted at song parodies as part of her well-known humor, writing several songs a year for the show in addition to performing in it the first year.

Ms. Kalson also revered the “canoe girls,” those ladies from her childhood Girl Scout troop who were now a raucous bunch of middle-aged women who continued to gather annually for dinners and a summer canoe trip.

In a column in 2008, she wrote about one of these cherished dinners.

“We clink glasses and drink, and the scene in front of me begins to swim. Damn, here I go again, misting up against my will. I detest sentimentality almost as much as spam, but my resistance is low and things that normally wouldn’t open the spigots are doing it now.

“It’s because I’m on chemo again, for the third time, and feeling variously fed up, sorry for myself or ticked off. In between, I do my best to enjoy life and be grateful for the things I have.”

I didn't know Sally Kalson personally, so my perspective is that of a long time reader. I once emailed her a thumbs-up for one of her Post-Gazette columns and mentioned I'd read her work at Pennsylvania Illustrated, a publication that given time and better revenues might have been the Keystone State's answer to Texas Monthly. She was surprised anyone remembered it. It's hard to recall the first Kalson piece I read, except it was something in the old In Pittsburgh newsweekly. I saw a few other pieces in the short-lived Pittsburgher Magazine and after that, her articles in PI.

Sally's style of journalism represented the best Pittsburgh has to offer, whether she covered hard news, wrote a particularly well-focused feature or the PG column she started in 1988. Always provocative and insightful, she held to a world view and moral compass that remained consistent, though her logic, like that of all great columnists, showed her marching to her own drummer. Even on the rare occasions when I disagreed, she impressed me with her ability to state her case intelligently and with genuine, sharp wit and humor, foregoing the obnoxious snark and overheated, simplistic rhetoric favored by certain columnists of both left and right.

Her illness, reflected that same noble empathy that came through in all her work was particularly acute when she offered that compassion to others whom she wrote about. Her Post-Gazette obituary includes some selected samples of her published columns. For those not familiar, it's well worth exploring. This region and the PG are all the richer for her insights. In an era when journalism is beleaguered, that work remains to inform, educate and to inspire. We will not see her like again.

Rebecca Lynn Pasach, a resident of Temple Terrace and former singer with the Master Chorale of Tampa Bay, died at her home Saturday. The cause of death was heart failure, her family said. Pasach, 50, was a tireless supporter of the area's nonprofit arts organizations, said Richard Zielinski, artistic director of the Master Chorale. "People like Rebecca, and her dedication, are why the Master Chorale is where it is today," he said.

"The quality of the group and its reputation is due to people like Rebecca. We will miss her." Pasach was an alto with the chorus for more than 15 years and served as its marketing and development director. She performed with 160 other singers in such acclaimed productions as Bach's B Minor Mass, Mendelssohn's "Elijah," Beethoven's "Missa Solemnis" and the Verdi Requiem. Pasach's biggest impact, however, was offstage. She promoted the arts on a grassroots level, said Susan Gill, a singer with the Master Chorale.

"With her great artistic ability, she designed all the posters, the programs and even the T- shirts for the Master Chorale," she said. "And for our first trip to England to sing with the London Bach Choir in 1996, she was instrumental in helping arrange everything." A lifelong resident of the Bay area, Pasach was a writer, graphic artist and fundraiser for charities. She worked in the 1980s for Florida Shirt Co. designing

custom T-shirts. She had worked for the past three months as a graphic artist for the Tampa Housing Authority.

UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA JOURNALISM DEAN RESIGNS AFTER 34 YEARS

ATHENS, Ga. -- After 34 years at the University of Georgia's Grady College of Journalism and Mass Communication, J. Thomas Russell announced that he will resign as dean effective June 30, 2000.

Russell said his decision is based on a desire to shift his focus back to teaching. On July 1, he will become the Phil Landrum Professor of Communications at Piedmont College, where a new mass

communication program is being planned.

"It was an opportunity too good to pass up," Russell said. "I always intended to go back to the classroom, and it's really exciting to get in on the ground floor of a new program."

Commenting on Russell's resignation, UGA President Michael F. Adams said: "I was surprised to learn today that Tom Russell has decided this will be his last year as dean. While I knew from some prior discussions that he was thinking about some other opportunities, I honestly thought it would be a year or two down the road. He has had a major impact on the success of the Grady College. I have high regard for his work and wish him well in his new capacity."

Regarding the search for a successor, Adams said: "It was only in the past 24 hours that the provost and I have discussed this for the first time. But we both agree that this search should be conducted as has every search for a vice president or dean on my watch -- that is with a comprehensive, open, national search for the best candidate available."

Russell joined the UGA faculty in 1967 and served as assistant dean from 1973-77. He was associate dean from 1977-81 and served as head of the advertising sequence from 1981-83, when he became dean of the College. Russell said he's seen the Grady College grow from three classrooms equipped with manual typewriters in the Commerce-Journalism Building, now Brooks Hall, to the state-of-the-art facility now housed in the journalism building. "I'm proud that our faculty members have been able to successfully integrate new technologies and continue to emphasize the importance of basic reporting and writing skills," Russell said.

With advertising professor W. Ronald Lane, Russell is author of the 14th edition of Kleppner's Advertising Procedures (Prentice-Hall Inc., 1998). After graduating from UGA in 1963, Russell earned a master's degree and a Ph.D. at the University of Illinois.
